What is SQS?

- SQS stands for "Service Quality Standards," which are established by the Social Welfare Department to monitor and evaluate the performance of service units.
- The "Service Quality Standards" specify the quality levels that service units should achieve in managing and providing services. These standards are based on four key principles: information provision, service management, service to users, and respect for the rights of service users.
- These four key principles are further divided into sixteen "Service Quality Standards." Our center provides services according to the sixteen Service Quality Standards established by the Social Welfare Department.

Service Quality Standards

SQS 1:	Service Information	The service unit ensures that a clear description of its purpose, objectives and mode of service delivery is publicly available.	
SQS 2:	Review and update policies and procedures	The service unit should review and update the documented policies and procedures describing how it will approach key service delivery issues.	
SQS 3:	Records	The service unit maintains accurate and current records of service operations and activities.	
SQS 4:	Roles and responsibilities	The roles and responsibilities of all staff, managers, the Management Committee and/or the Board or other decision-making bodies should be clearly defined.	
SQS 5:	Human Resources	The service unit/agency implements effective staff recruitment, contracting, development, training, assessment, deployment and disciplinary practices.	
SQS 6:	Planning, evaluation and feedback	The service unit regularly plans, reviews and evaluates its own performance, and has an effective mechanism by which service users, staff and other interested parties can provide feedback on its performance.	
SQS 7:	Financial management	The service unit implements policies and procedures to ensure effective financial management.	
SQS 8:	Legal obligations	The service unit complies with all relevant legal obligations.	
SQS 9:	Safe physical environment	The service unit takes all reasonable steps to ensure that it provides a safe physical environment for its staff and service users.	
SQS 10:	Entry and Exit	The service unit ensures that service users have clear and accurate information about how to enter and leave the service.	
SQS 11:	Needs of service users	The service unit has a planned approach to assessing and meeting service users' needs (whether the service user is an individual, family, group or community).	
SQS 12:	Informed choice	The service unit respects the service users' right to make informed choices of the service they receive as far as practicable.	D
SQS 13:	Private Property	The service unit respects the service users' rights in relation to private property.	
SQS 14:	Privacy and confidentiality	The service unit respects the service users' rights for privacy and confidentiality.	
SQS 15:	Complaints	Each service user and staff member is free to raise and have addressed, without fear of retribution, any complaints he or she may have regarding the agency or the service unit.	
SQS 16:	Freedom from abuse	The service unit takes all reasonable steps to ensure that service users are free from abuse.

The Importance of Care: When others care for you, cherish you, and treat you gently, it truly contributes to your physical and mental well-being Josh McDowell, author of "How To Be A Hero To Your kids"

Building a relationship with your child is like managing an emotional bank account. Deposits (expressions of love) make the other person feel loved, while withdrawals (blame and criticism) make them feel hurt. If the account is well-funded, minor issues can be easily resolved; conversely, a heavily indebted account can turn small mistakes into major offenses. Ways to make deposits in the relationship include expressing love frequently, which helps strengthen both marital and parent-child bonds.

A stable marital relationship also helps children feel the warmth of love at home. Parents can try to pay attention to the love languages of their children.

What is national security?

National security means the status in which the state's political regime, sovereignty, unity and territorial integrity, the welfare of the people, sustainable economic and social development, and other major interests-of-the-state-are-relatively-free-from-danger-and-internal-orexternal threats, and the capability to maintain a sustained status of security

How important is national security?

The principle of national security is to accord top priority to national interests. National security concerns the welfare of the 1.4 billion -people-of-the-whole-country-and-is-an-important-cornerstone-for-peace and stability of a nation. When the country's core interests are at risk, national security will be threatened and there will be no security for the people.

Hong kong's Constitutional Duty: Jointly Safeguarding National Security

Safeguarding national security is the overarching responsibility of the Central People's Government and the -constitutional-responsibility-of-the-Hong-Kong-Special-Administrative-Region,-and-is-the-common-responsibility-of all the people of China, including the people of Hong Kong.
